# **TOWN NEWS**

#### **New Businesses**

#### **Tanyard Hill Construction**

Construction work to replace a water line on Tanyard Hill has begun and will continue until October 31. Detours are via Washington and Commerce Streets.

#### Noise Ordinance

At the September 5th Council meeting, the Town Council adopted a new noise ordinance that uses decibel (dB) standards to regulate permissible levels of noise throughout the various zoning districts of the Town. In the B-1 Zoning District and the Old and Historic Occoquan Overlay District, **the maximum permissible sound pressure level is 65 decibels during the daytime and 60 decibels after 10pm.** Restaurants are exempt up to 80 decibels during the daytime.

Daytime means the local time of day between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. on weekdays and from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. on Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays observed by the Town government, unless otherwise specified.

## **Real Estate Tax**

Annually, the Occoquan Town Council sets a tax rate for real estate. This tax is in addition to Prince William County's real estate tax. The total real estate tax amount is paid in one lump sum, due December 5th of each year. Invoices are being mailed. The tax rate is expressed in dollars per one hundred dollars of assessed value. The tax rate for 2023 assessments is \$0.116 per \$100 of the assessed value.

### Fall Weekend Shuttle Service

Free shuttle service continues from the VDOT lot on 123 & Old Bridge Road, with a drop off at Mamie Davis Park in historic Occoquan Saturdays this season until December 16. Additional shuttle service will be provided Friday, October 27 from 4pm to 10:30pm for the Murder Mystery plus December 2, from 10am-8pm and December 3, from 10am-5pm for Artisan Market weekend. ### Mill Street Draft Garden Restrooms

The restrooms at the Mill Street Draft Garden are open to the public when the Garden is open for business. Access is to the rear of the building. Current hours: Tues-Thu, 3pm – Close; Friday, 12pm - Close; and Sat-Sun, 11am - Close.

#### **Occoquan Business Partners**

#### Fall Arts & Crafts Show

As you know, we had to cancel our Fall Arts & Crafts Show last month due to the arrival of Tropical Storm Ophelia. That was a tough decision as revenues generated from our events go directly into the Town's capital improvement program. This major adjustment caused staff to rethink planning for holiday.

After much discussion, staff decided to extend the footprint of the Artisan Market on December 2 & 3 from River Mill Park up to Mill Street at Ellicott. All other streets in town will remain open and free shuttle service will be available throughout the weekend.

Town Businesses are welcome to register for a 10 x 10 booth space within the venue footprint. The cost is \$175 for the weekend. Businesses that have a credit from the Fall Arts & Crafts Show may transfer their fees to the Holiday Artisan Market or RiverFest, or have it refunded. We recognize that our community partners are uniquely qualified to assist OPD personnel during an incident. You know what belongs and what is out of place. Sharing your perspective and working together, we are better prepared to face the most difficult challenges.

- The OPD "See Something/Say Something" and Suspicious Activity Reporting (SAR) Initiatives
- The OPD Neighborhood Watch, Business Watch, Worship Watch, and Dog Walker Watch Initiatives
- The OPD SHIELD Program keeps its partners informed of upcoming events, new intelligence and crime/ terrorism related information developing within the Town of Occoquan and the region.
